**LAWRENCE TOWNSHIP ANNOUNCES RELEASE OF THE 2ND EDITION OF
A Guide to Lawrenceville's Historic Landmarks**

A Guide to Lawrenceville's Historic Landmarks went on sale at Lawrence Township's Community Day program on Sunday, October 4th. The price is \$7.00. First and second printings of this book, in 1992 and 1993, sold out quickly and have in fact, become collectors' items with used copies on sale on Amazon.com this past year for \$12.

The guide has 70 pages packed with all-new and large color photos in addition to color-coded maps with updated facts, stories and anecdotes about Lawrenceville's landmarks and history.

The guide is a paperback that can be carried along on tours of town but large enough, at 8"x10-1/2", to be displayed at home or given away to friends, neighbors, visiting out-of-towners or customers who may have an interest in the township's architecture and history. The attractive guide will make local residents proud, contribute to their appreciation of the community's treasured resources and help make the town's landmarks come alive when used for self-guided walking and driving tours. Three color-coded maps – including two pullout maps -- will assist in taking five different tours to landmarks in different parts of town. The selection and inclusion of landmarks on the various tours is based on touring convenience.

Dan Ben-Asher, a local volunteer who headed up the first edition, is the Editor and Photographer of this one as well. He received research assistance from several other local historians. Paul Schindel of Three Bears in Princeton, another Lawrenceville resident, handled the new art work and Dennis Waters, Township Historian, coordinated the graphics, printing and marketing.

This publication was financed in part with Federal funds from the National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior, and administered by the N.J Department of Environmental Protection, Historic Preservation Office. The Lawrenceville School also provided a grant for the publication. Back in 1992, Lawrence Township had the honor of being the very first community in the State to be awarded a similar Federal-State local government grant for the first edition of this publication.

After Community Day, the Guide will be available for purchase at the Lawrence Township Municipal Clerk's office, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM. Additional distribution locations will be announced at a later date.
