Lawrenceville Township Opens Inclusionary Playground at Central Park

Lawrence Township, N.J. – On July 11, Lawrence Township officially opened a new, inclusionary playground at Central Park, located on Eggert Crossing Road in Lawrence Township, New Jersey. Construction was supported, in part, by a \$100,000 donation from The Lawrenceville School.

This custom designed playground will be universally accessible and inclusive for all children and adults. The playground design will address the needs of everyone in the community regardless of physical or cognitive abilities.

“This playground is the successful culmination of good, talented people coming together to accomplish something significant and important in this community. I know that this project was a very important one to my predecessor Richard Krawzcun, and that the finished product is everything that he hoped it would be”. Kevin Nerwinski, Municipal Manager of Lawrence Township further said, “While attending the ribbon cutting ceremony, the site of seeing all of the children enthusiastically exploring and playing within it left me with the feeling that, yes, today was a good day.”

“Watching Central Park evolve from drawings to an actual playground – accessible to all children - has been a privilege. It was great fun to see the joy on the Township children’s faces as they officially opened the park and began making memories in their new play space,” said Lawrenceville School Head Master Steve Murray. “At the Lawrenceville School, we celebrate and reinforce the importance of our on- and off-campus communities, so we are grateful for yet another opportunity to partner with the Township.”

The Lawrenceville School is pleased to have another opportunity to partner with the Township to benefit local youth. In 2016, the School topped \$1.3 million in donations to the Lawrence Township Education Foundation (since the organization’s 1992 inception) and also contributed \$10,000 to the Lawrence Township Community Foundation and \$5,000 to Lawrenceville Main Street.
