Lawrence Township Swears In Mayor Bobbitt, Council Members for New Terms

Christopher Bobbitt was sworn in for his second term as Mayor of Lawrence Township during the January 1st, 2026 reorganization meeting, with the oath of office administered by State Senator Shirley Turner. Newly reelected Council members Jim Kownacki and Amanda Santos were also sworn in alongside Mayor Bobbitt, who is now in his fourth term on Township Council.

In his remarks, Mayor Bobbitt quoted Congressman Augustus Hawkins: "Leadership belongs not to the loudest, not to those who beat the drums or blow the trumpets, but to those who day in and day out, in all seasons, work for the practical realization of a better world." This principle of consistent engagement has guided Mayor Bobbitt throughout his public service, which began in 2005 with nearly a decade on a township committee before his election to Council in 2015.

During his first term as Mayor (2018-2019), Bobbitt worked with Council and Township Manager Kevin Nerwinski to rebuild township staff strategically, resulting in improved service delivery, sustainable operations, and a stronger grant writing program that has enhanced services. He emphasized his commitment to the fundamental work of local government: ensuring safe communities, well-maintained infrastructure, and opportunities for residents of all ages.

Mayor Bobbitt highlighted Lawrence's greatest strength—its people and diversity. "That spirit of 'E pluribus unum,' or 'out of many, one,' is alive and well in Lawrence," he stated, noting how the community comes together at parades, memorials, and gatherings to celebrate their beloved township.

Mayor Bobbitt earned degrees from Stanford University and UC Berkeley and lives in Colonial Lakelands with his wife Tiffany and children Frances and Henry. He thanked his family for their support and for reminding him why this work matters.

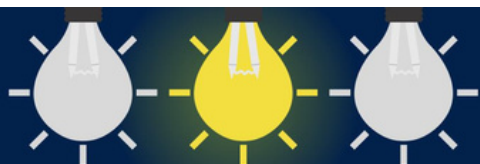

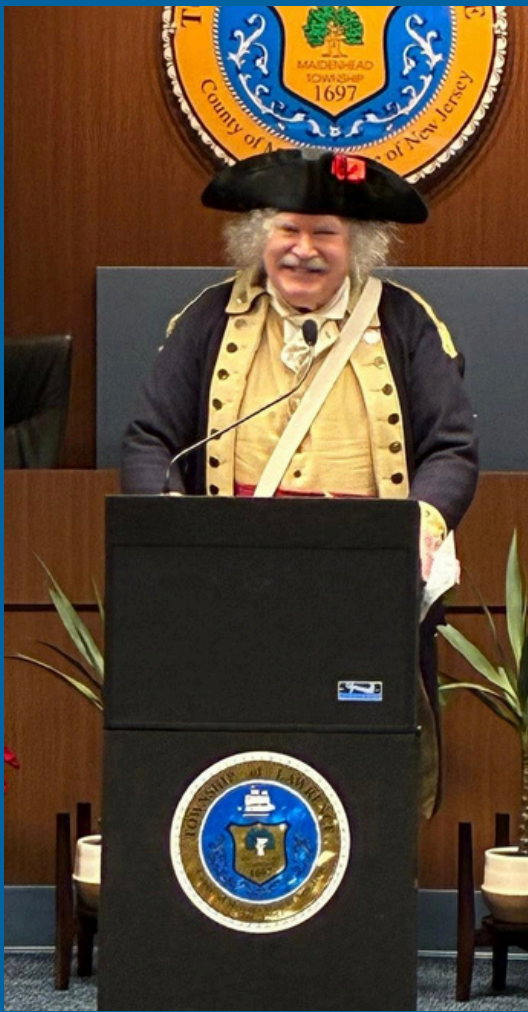
