Lawrence Township just earned SILVER—a significant honor that places us among NJ's leading sustainable communities. But we've heard the question: "Why not Gold?"

Here's the key: Sustainable Jersey's Gold is NOT a higher level of municipal certification. It's a specialized "Gold Star" designation awarded only in limited categories (like Energy or Water) and requires meeting extremely demanding, measurable standards across the ENTIRE community—including utilities, private-sector energy use, water agencies, and resident behavior that municipalities cannot directly control.

Gold Stars also require extensive data modeling, technical verification, long-term monitoring, and often substantial capital investment. Only a handful of NJ towns have achieved Gold in any category.

Our Silver Certification reflects the excellent sustainability work our township CAN control—and we're already excelling at it.

We're grateful to Lawrence Township resident Bonne O'Flanagan Giglio for stepping up to organize the November food drive! Thanks to her dedication and the generosity of our community, she collected and donated 5 large deliveries of food to neighbors in need through Arm and Arm.
