Make a Supply Kit



Have a **portable emergency supply kit** ready with a **5 day supply** of necessities.

Include:

- medications
- a first aid kit
- water
- water filter
- food
- important documents
- money
- pet care items
- blankets
- personal hygiene products
- flashlights
- batteries
- cell phones
- chargers
- cooking & repair supplies

Create a Plan



- Look over your **home insurance plan** to see how it covers natural disasters.
- If you live in a hurricane evacuation zone, **practice** using **different evacuation routes**, and make an **evacuation plan**.
- Create a **communications plan** with all household members to use in **emergencies**.
- Keep a **written list** of **important phone numbers**.
