Beware of any birds acting sickly or unusual:

- ✓ Coughing
- ✓ Trouble breathing
- ✓ Trouble walking
- ✓ Injured / unable to fly
- ✓ Neurological symptoms
- ✓ Unknown cause of death

Avoid stepping in bird droppings

Double bag and place in municipal trash
