Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD):

More Than the Winter Blues

As the days get shorter and there is less daylight, you may start to feel sad. While many people experience the "winter blues," some people may have a type of depression called seasonal affective disorder (SAD).

The first step is to determine how much your symptoms interfere with your daily life.

Do you have mild symptoms that have lasted less than 2 weeks?



- Feeling down but still able to take care of yourself and others
- Having some trouble sleeping
- Having less energy than usual but still able to do your job, schoolwork, or housework

These activities can make you feel better:



- Doing something you enjoy
- Going outside in the sunlight
- Spending time with family and friends
- Eating healthy and avoiding foods with lots of sugar

If these activities do not help or your symptoms are getting worse, talk to a health care provider.

Do you have more severe symptoms that have lasted more than 2 weeks?



- Social withdrawal
- Oversleeping
- Gaining weight
- Craving foods with lots of sugar like cakes, candies, and cookies

Seek professional help:



- Light therapy
- Psychotherapy (talk therapy)
- Medications
- Vitamin D supplements

Stuffy nose	Common	Sometimes

Food Safety at Home



1. Clean

Always wash your food, hands, counters, and cooking tools.

- Wash hands in warm soapy water for at least 20 seconds.
 Do this before and after touching food.
- Wash your cutting boards, dishes, forks, spoons, knives, and counter tops with hot soapy water. Do this after working with each food item.
- Rinse fruits and veggies.
- Do not wash meat, poultry, fish, or eggs. If water splashes from the sink in the process of washing, it can spread bacteria.
- Clean the lids on canned goods before opening.



2. Separate (Keep Apart)

Keep raw foods to themselves. Germs can spread from one food to another.

- Keep raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs away from other foods.
 Do this in your shopping cart, bags, and fridge.
- Do not reuse marinades used on raw foods unless you bring them to a boil first.
- Use a special cutting board or plate for raw foods only.



3. Cook

Foods need to get hot and stay hot. Heat kills germs.

- Cook to safe temperatures:
 - Beef, Pork, Lamb 145 °F
 - Fish 145 °F
 - Ground Beef, Pork, Lamb 160 °F
 - Turkey, Chicken, Duck 165 °F
- Use a food thermometer to make sure that food is done. You can't always tell by looking.



4. Chill

Put food in the fridge right away.

- 2-Hour Rule: Put foods in the fridge or freezer within 2 hours after cooking or buying from the store.
 Do this within 1 hour if it is 90 degrees or hotter outside.
- Never thaw food by simply taking it out of the fridge. Thaw food:
 - In the fridge
 - Under cold water
 - In the microwave
- Marinate foods in the fridge.



Food Safety at Home

Why should you care about food safety?

Each year millions of people get sick from food illnesses. Food illness can cause you to feel like you have the flu. Food illness can also cause serious health problems, even death.

Think you have a food illness?

Call your doctor and get medical care right away.

- Save the food package, can, or carton.
- Call USDA at 1-888-674-6854 for meat, poultry, or eggs.
- Call FDA at 1-866-300-4374 for all other foods.
- Call your local health department if you think you got sick from food you ate in a restaurant or other food seller.

Who is at risk?

Anyone can get sick from eating spoiled food. Some people are more likely to get sick from food illnesses.

- Pregnant women
- Older Adults
- People with certain health conditions like cancer, HIV/AIDS, diabetes, and kidney disease

Some foods are more risky for these people. Talk to your doctor or other health provider about which foods are safe for you to eat.

Operation Blue Angel

The Lawrence Township Police Department is happy to announce the availability of the Operation Blue Angel program for Lawrence Township residents. This free program is open to residents who are 55 years of age or older and live alone or will be alone for extended periods of time on a regular basis; or for people with a medical condition(s) that could lead to incapacitation and who live alone or who are alone for extended periods of time on a regular basis.

The program consists of a lockbox, which will be owned and maintained by the Police Department, which will be placed on the participant's property by Police personnel. The lockbox will contain a key to the residence (which the resident must supply). The key will only be accessed by responding police officers in the event of an emergency where officers cannot access the residence. The Operation Blue Angel program lockbox will not be accessed for lock-outs or any other non-emergent situation.

The Lawrence Home Improvement Program

Lawrence is accepting names for participation in its municipally sponsored home improvement program for low and moderate-income families. Your name can be added to the waiting list by calling our program consultant Affordable Housing Administrators at 732-966-0674.

Eligible home improvements include roofing, windows, electrical upgrades, heating systems, water heaters, insulation, plumbing and any other health, safety or code violations. The program is structured as a forgivable loan. There are no monthly payments and no interest. If you stay in your home for ten years, you will owe nothing to Lawrence.

The program is available for owner-occupied single-family homes, condominiums, townhomes and duplexes in which the owner occupies one of the units. To be eligible to participate, your gross annual income (meaning pre-tax income) for all household members must be less than:




