LAWRENCE TOWNSHIP BRING YOUR BAG!

Beginning May 4, 2022, the state law prohibits all stores from selling to, or providing their customers with single-use plastic carryout bags

A "reusable carryout bag" must:

- Be made of polypropylene fabric, PET non-woven fabric, nylon, cloth, hemp product, or other washable fabric
- Shall have stitched handles. Adhesive handles are not permitted.
- Shall be constructed for a minimum of 125 uses

NEW JERSEY EFFECTIVE 5/4/22

- BAN ON SINGLE-USE CARRYOUT BAGS
- BAN ON POLYSTYRENE FOAM FOOD SERVICE PRODUCTS
- BAN ON PLASTIC STRAWS (BY REQUEST ONLY) Effective November 4, 2021, food

Effective November 4, 2021, food service businesses shall only provide a single use plastic straw to a customer upon request.

Grocery stores larger than 2,500 square feet may not provide or sell single-use paper carry out bags and instead may provide or sell reusable carryout bags

Single-use bag exemptions:

- Contain or wrap uncooked meat, fish, or poultry
- Contain food sliced or prepared to order
- Contain live animals, such as fish or insects sold in a pet store
- Package loose items such as fruits, vegetables, nuts, coffee, grains, baked goods, candy, greeting cards, flowers, bulk food, or small hardware items
- Dry cleaning bags
- Pharmacy/Prescription drug bags
- Newspaper bags
