I-295 southbound Exit 69B to Route 206 southbound to be closed through August beginning tonight in Mercer County Right lane closure on I-295 southbound necessary to install barrier

(Trenton) – I-295 southbound Exit 69B to Route 206 southbound is scheduled to be closed and detoured beginning tonight and continuing through August as a noise barrier installation project advances in Lawrence, Mercer County. In addition, the right lane on I-295 southbound is scheduled to be closed just before Exit 69B to install construction barrier and close the ramp.

Beginning at 8 p.m. tonight, Thursday, June 4 until 6 a.m. tomorrow, Friday, June 5, the right lane on I-295 southbound is scheduled to be closed near the Route 206 interchange, from mile post 69.4 to mile post 70. At least two lanes will be maintained. Motorists are advised to slow down, use caution and expect delays when driving through the work zone. The right lane closure is necessary to place barrier and implement a long-term ramp closure of the I-295 southbound Exit 69B ramp to Route 206 southbound. The long-term ramp closure is necessary to install noise barriers on I-295 southbound. The following detour will be in place starting at 8 p.m. tonight, Thursday, June 4 and continuing through August 31:

I-295 southbound Exit 69B to Route 206 southbound Detour:

- Motorists on I-295 southbound wishing to take Exit 69B to Route 206 South/Trenton will be directed to continue on I-295 southbound
- Take Exit 69A to Route 206 North/Lawrenceville/Princeton
- Stay right to take the ramp to I-295 northbound
- Stay right to take Exit 69B to Route 206 South/Trenton

Construction is being coordinated with the lane closures associated with the Princeton Pike Bridge over I-295 replacement project. For more information on that project, visit: bit.ly/4piFKcc.

This work is part of the \$11.5 million I-295 Noise Barriers project, which will construct noise barriers along I-295 southbound from mile post 69.4 to mile post 70. Other improvements include the construction of retention basins in the median and along I-295 northbound. The project is expected to be completed in late summer 2026.

The precise timing of the work is subject to change due to weather or other factors.
